OUR STORY


Founded in 1996, Harmony began as a private adoption agency. Since then, our services have expanded to include programming across the state of Tennessee that supports children and families at every phase of the foster care and adoption journey - from inquiring to become a foster parent through in-home support for adoptive families. Recognizing the need for family connection and attachment, Harmony purchased Camp Montvale in 2010 which we use as a therapeutic camp to host adoptive families, foster and adopted children, equine therapy, and as a gathering space for our community. Harmony has always been committed to standing in the gap where there are unmet needs and our work in the foster care and adoption field led us to specialize in experiences of trauma, their impact on the brain, and what it takes to heal. We have expanded our services to include training our communities on this vital information as well as serving the public via our outpatient therapy center in Knoxville.

EVERY STEP OF THE JOURNEY

Harmony's FOCUS (Finding our Children Unconditional Support) and Permanency Programs work together to find forever families for children in foster care. These children are often more challenging to place because of their length of time in custody, history of multiple home or residential placements, and their emotional, medical, and behavioral needs.

These programs have served **1,130 children** this year resulting in **347 adoptions** and 348 children finding other forms of permanency.

SUPPORTING ADOPTIVE



Adoption & Guardianship Preparation Training (AGPT)

Harmony provides free, required training to all DCS pre-adoptive families in Tennessee. The curriculum is designed to support adoptive and guardianship parents in deepening their understanding of themselves and their child while building a lasting bond and commitment. This year, Harmony trained **879 pre-adoptive parents**.

Adoption & Guardianship Support and Preservation Program (ASAP & GSAP)

The ASAP program provides trauma-informed therapeutic and educational services that are individualized to meet the unique needs of adoptive and guardianship families. Our seamless, statewide system of intensive in-home services, diverse educational offerings, and supportive enrichment activities are free to any family who has adopted or assumed guardianship through the public child welfare system in Tennessee. Harmony's clinicians served 353 families through in-home therapeutic services this year.

FAMILIES

The Resource Center

The Resource Center is designed to provide adoptive families with training, community connections, and supportive services. This year, the Resource Center trained 922 adoptive parents and served 706 people via support groups and family connection events staffed by professionals with lived experience as adoptive parents. The Resource Center also provides Educational Advocacy and Parent Coaching and served 215 parents this year through those programs.





In 2023 Spaulding for Children, in collaboration with Harmony and other organizations received a five-year grant from the Children's Bureau to facilitate the establishment of a National Center for Enhanced Post-Adoption Support. As a partner agency in the National Center, Harmony's role includes development of a Post Permanency Support Model, and provision of technical assistance to states, tribes and territories who want to build more robust post-adoption programs. Harmony is fortunate to work alongside our national partners and use our expertise in postadoption services to build support for families across the country.

Post- Tennessee requires adoptive families receiving adoption assistance to provide documentation **Adopt** verifying the child has attended an appointment within the last year or educational **Annual** documentation verifying the child is enrolled in school full-time. Harmony completes this work **Review** and was in contact with over **10,264 families** to complete their requirements this year.

Today, the 354-acre property is home to a variety of programs and services including therapeutic camps staffed by Harmony's experienced team. We are committed to continuing to expand our programming to include children, families, adults, and communities who would benefit from the healing that takes place at Montvale.

Therapeutic Camps

This year, Harmony hosted 18
therapeutic camps and retreats at
Montvale with 540 attendees. Camps
for foster and adoptive children and
families are meant to build family
attachment, strengthen skills, and offer
healing through nature-based
therapeutic activities including equine,
drumming, yoga, hiking, crafts, a
climbing tower and more.

Montvale provides the perfect environment for growth through relationship with animals. Since the beginning of our equine-assisted therapy program, over **1,300 people** have had therapeutic interactions with our horses at Montvale.



Events at Montvale

Events held at Montvale Springs allow Harmony to continue to fund and expand our therapeutic work and ensure that Montvale continues to be a place of healing for generations to come.

This year, we held our 12th annual Mudder's Day Madness Mud Run at Montvale. Proceeds from the event totaled \$55K with over 615 runners in our 5K and 10K races. We also hosted Music at Montvale events featuring Scott Miller and Emily Ann Roberts with proceeds totaling \$42K and over 725 attendees.



Therapeutic Services




Our Therapeutic Services outpatient center uses a range of modalities to serve adults, families, children, and adolescents through individual, family, and group therapy. Our clinicians specialize in the treatment of trauma and have served 162 clients this year in the Knoxville area and statewide via telehealth.

Therapeutic Services clinicians also served 345 individuals through collaborative partnerships with community providers.

Our team partners with local organizations to support their clients including The Restoration House, Fig Tree, Maryville City Schools, Olive Tree Early Learning Academy, and Knox County Schools.





Community Training & Retreats




Harmony provides nationally recognized training and retreats on trauma-responsive techniques and therapeutic practices for caregivers, professionals, and community organizations. Our trainers use the latest research, combined with their lived experience as parents and professionals, to present practical approaches to real-life challenges.

This year, Harmony delivered 50 trainings to the community that were attended by over 1,694 parents, professionals, educators, and community members.






